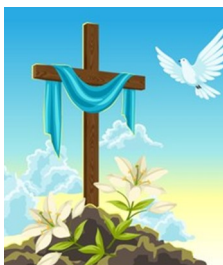

PALM SUNDAY, GOOD FRIDAY, AND EASTER IS UPON US. A TIME TO CELEBRATE OUR LORD!

Join us in the Chapel April 10 for a special Palm Sunday service at 11am to celebrate the welcoming of Christ prior to His crucifixion.

During Holy Week, we focus on the arrival, crucifixion, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ through readings, prayer, and Lent.

His resurrection proves he was exactly who He said He was. The public saw him on the cross with the spear in his side. He was buried in a tomb and rose 3 days later, appearing to his disciples and over 500 witnesses.
