WELCOME TO MARCH



On Tuesday, March 17, we celebrate one of the world's most popular saints, St Patrick, who was held as a slave sheepherder from age 14 to 20. He eventually escaped, finding some sailors who took him back to Britain where he was reunited with his family.

Having an experience with God and seeing a vision, St Patrick later studied for the priesthood, was ordained a bishop and sent to take the Gospel to all of Ireland.

After an intervention from God, Patrick was able to convert thousands, preaching the Gospel throughout Ireland. He began building churches across the country, often using **shamrocks** to explain the Holy Trinity (Father, Son, Holy Ghost).

Entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message.

He preached throughout Ireland for 40 years, dying on March 17, 461, where he built the first Irish church.

Still today, we continue to celebrate the day set aside to remember St. Patrick. Share his story with someone!


