NEW BEGININGS



The third day after his crucifixion on Good Friday, we celebrate our Lord's resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Good Friday is the day Christians commemorate the suffering and crucifixion of our Lord by the Roman empire in Jerusalem where the entire public witnessed him on the cross. After the crucifixion, "one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water" (John 19:34), confirming his death.

He was buried in a tomb and as was customary, the women of the Bible went to anoint Jesus' body where they were greeted by angels who told them he was not there; "He has risen as he said he would". (Matthew 28:6). After being buried in a tomb, on the third day, Jesus rose and appeared to his disciples and many witnesses.

His resurrection proves he was exactly Who he said He was, proves his authority and the importance of his teachings. According to scripture, the crucifixion and resurrection guarantees all believers and followers that the penalty for our sins has been paid in full. The resurrection guarantees Jesus' return and our justification.

Our hope is in Christ and the sacrifice He made for us. No one TOOK His life, Jesus GAVE his life as a ransom for us. There is new hope for a new life in Christ and that He will return for his children.

For this reason, we rejoice! He laid down his life, yet- HE HAS RISEN! For many, this day marks new beginnings and fresh starts.

Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection is the anchor of every hope we have and ultimately the anchor of hope for all mankind (Hebrews 6:17-20).
