Treasurer's Report – Janet Lickman

The Resident Committee fund account currently holds a balance of \$7,238.28. The Sugar Bowl fund stands at \$1,286.26, following a recent collection of \$73.00 at the last meeting. There was an of \$250.00 cover entertainment costs, bringing the current Sugar Bowl balance to \$1,109.25. A question was raised regarding the contribution to this year's Christmas Bonus Fund. In the past a donation of \$2000 was made. The motion was made and approved for \$2,000 to be allocated again this year.

UPDATED INFORMATION:

The Shell Gas station located at 33925 23 Mile Road (across the street from CVS and next door to the Chesterfield Fire Station) is offering to pump gas for handicapped residents on Tuesdays between the hours of 11:30am -1:30pm ***IF YOU HAVE A HANDICAPPED LISENCE PLATE OR PLACARD DISPLAYED.***



According to the owner of the station, due to anti-discrimination laws, they are offering this service to anyone with visible proof of handicap displayed on their vehicle such as a hanging placard or handicapped license plate. Just call 586-648-7072 and let them know what pump you are at and an attendant will come out and pump your gas for you! The owner of the gas station has gone to great lengths to facilitate this program. If customers are not taking advantage of this opportunity it is likely he will eventually discontinue this service. It has been suggested to keep a reminder note in your car to try to pump gas at this time so that we can continue to utilize this service. It will definitely be desirable as the weather gets colder! If you need yet more incentive, you can also use your Kroger points at participating Shell stations!
