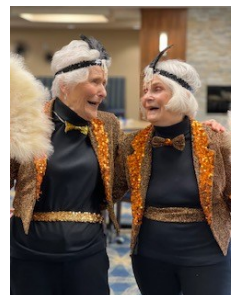

Meeting called to order by: Colleen Burger, VP in place of Pat McClellan, President who is ill.

## Budget

Treasure's Report given by Janet Lickman. January ending balance was \$4591.00. December sugar bowl donation \$65.00, January donation was \$62.00, which brought balance \$4718.00. \$3516.00. The receipt of \$2,550.00 from the Candlelight Dinner and receipts of \$966.00 from the bazaar which have not been posted yet, so the balance at the foundation is still \$5113.00.

UPDATE: Dr. Pat McClellan, President of the Residents Committee was admitted to hospital and found to have pressure on his spinal cord and underwent surgery. This given him relief of pain but he is still unable to walk. He will undergo physical therapy to build up his strength and be able to use a wheelchair. Further updates in the future.
